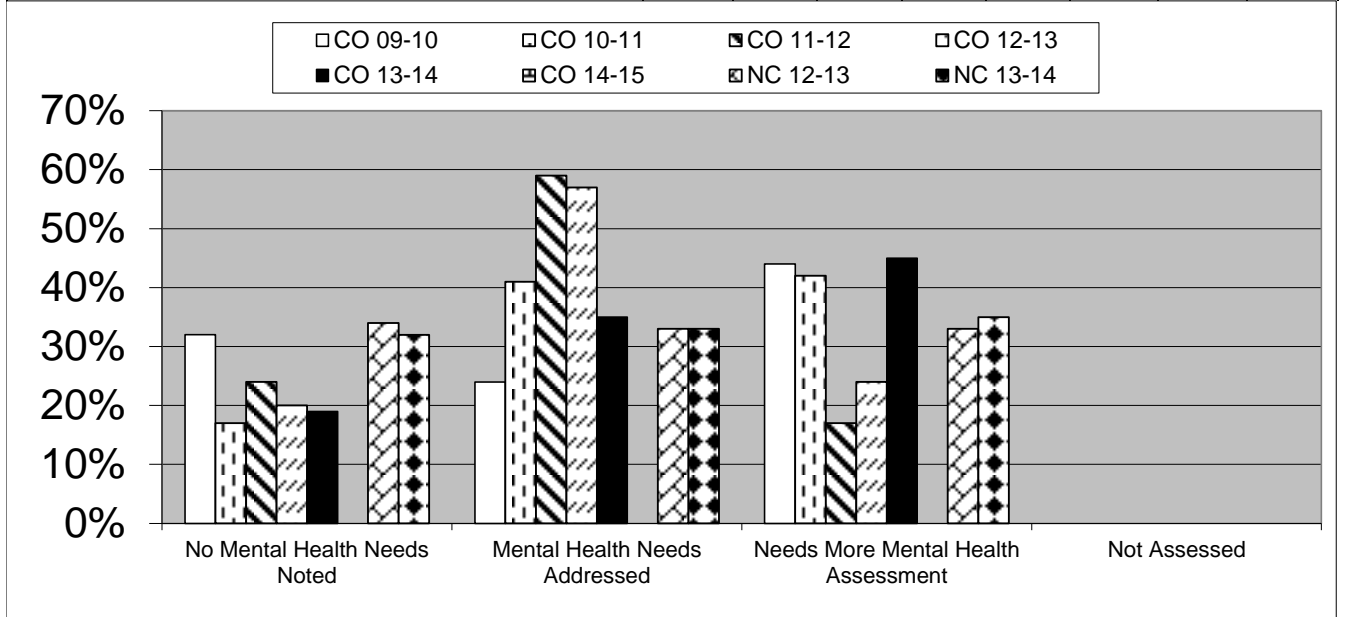
Y6 Observations: County data for the five year period reflects that on average 44.2% of youth report abuse of abuse/neglect with support.

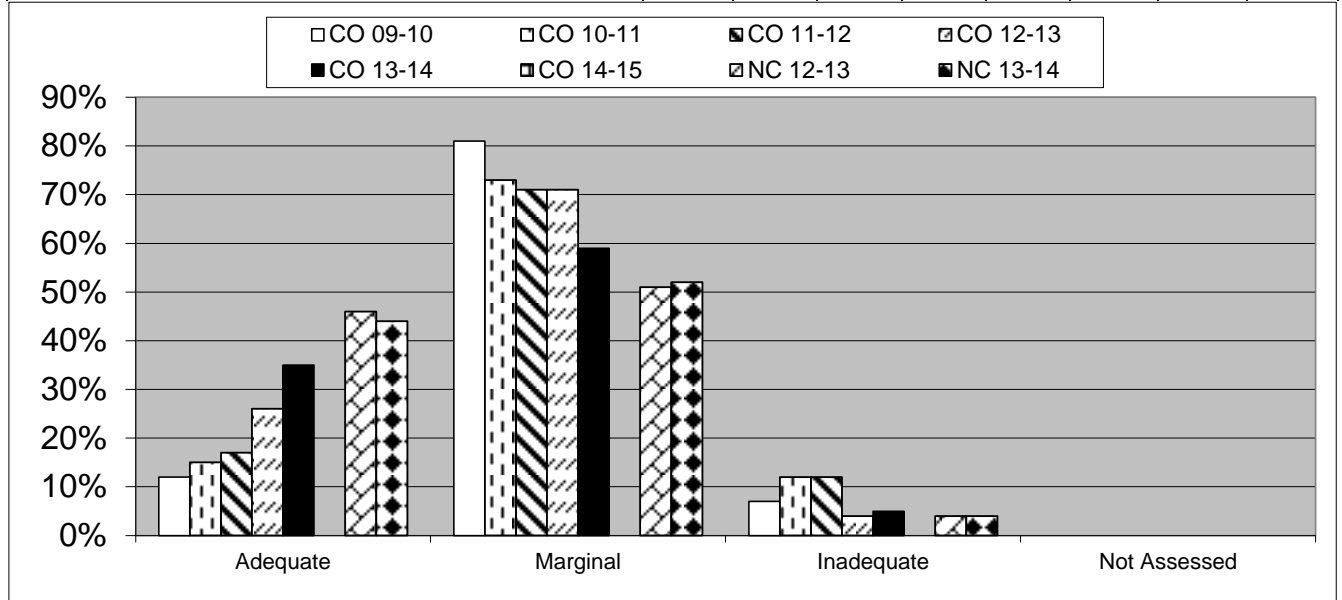

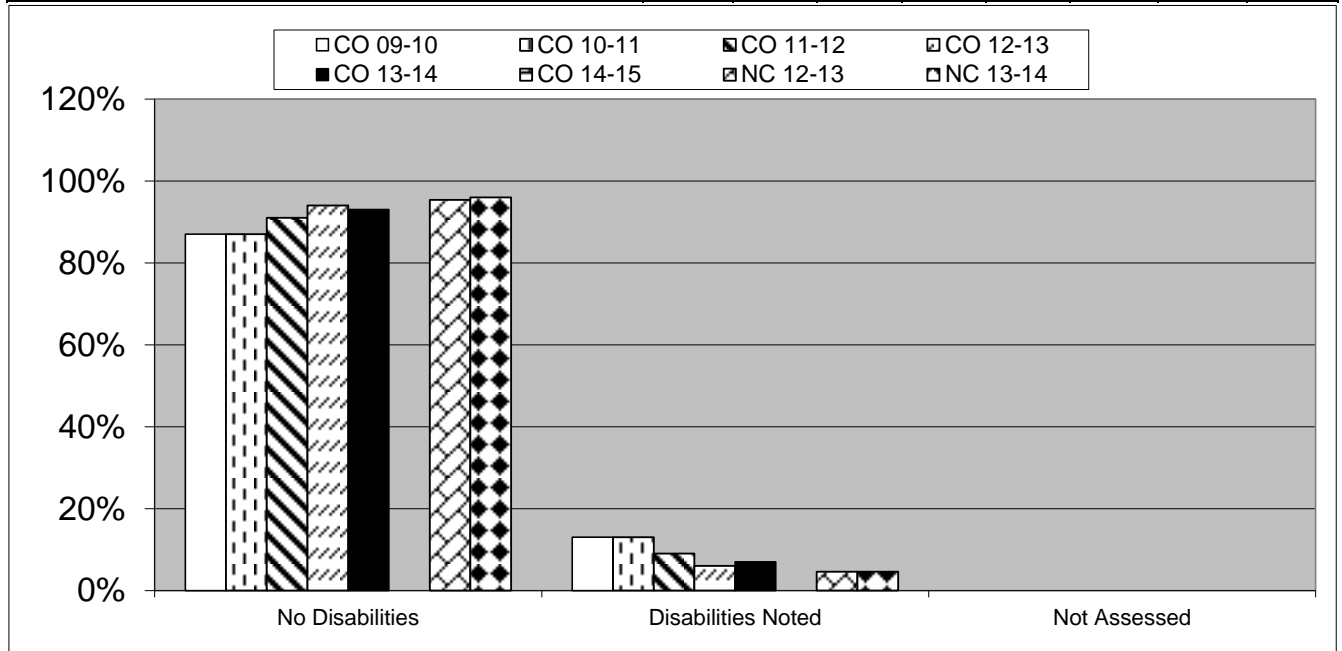

F5 Observations: County data for the five year period reflects that on average 44.2% of youth's parent/guardian/custodian and/siblings have a Criminal History; and on average 23.6% are actively on Court Supervision and/or had Gang involvement. NOTE/OBSERVATION: This is significantly higher than the State average for FY 12-13 and FY 13-14.
